

**JAKE CHILES ELECTED  
MAYOR OF KENILWORTH**

**POLLS BIG VOTE IN MUNICIPAL  
ELECTION.**

**E. G. Hester, Morris Myers and Roland A. Wilson, Chosen as the  
Town Commissioners.**

In the municipal elections held yesterday at the town of Kenilworth under the commission form of government, six votes were cast out of a total of seven eligible electors and all but two of those who cast ballots at the election were elected to important offices.

Jake M. Chiles was elected mayor and three commissioners were chosen as follows: E. G. Hester, Morris Meyers and Roland A. Wilson. Mr. Meyers has been mayor for the past ten years. Under the present administration he will serve as a commissioner but just what departments of the city government will be under his control will be determined later.

Kenilworth was incorporated as a town a dozen or more years ago and before the hotel was burned there were several hundred residents in the town; there are still thirty or more residents, but all residents are not eligible to vote, as they must have lived in the state for a period of two years before they can cast a ballot.

Asked to make a statement on the election, Mayor Chiles declared that he was very much gratified at the high percentage of qualified voters who cast their votes for the new administration. Mayor Chiles expressed pride over the fact that the entire cost of the election was only thirty-five cents. This was paid for new registration books. Nothing was spent for the printing of ballots. Mayor Chiles pegged them out on his typewriter. A cigar box with a hole on the top of the lid served for a ballot box.

An economical and business-like administration of the town's affairs is promised by the newly elected mayor. He wishes to express his appreciation on behalf of himself and the other gentlemen elected to serve with him as commissioner to the voters for their support at the polls. He extends their sincere thanks.

"More voters," declared Mayor Chiles, "is one of the chief needs of Kenilworth. Kenilworth is bound to grow. We are going to make a real town of it and what we need is more residents, more homes and more voters."
